


STEPS TO RESTORING POWER

When a major outage occurs, our crews restore services to the greatest number of people in the shortest time possible – until all members have power.



AN OUTAGE IS REPORTED

A member calls in to notify Slope Electric that they are without power.





3 CREWS RESTORE POWER TO HIGH-VOLTAGE TRANSMISSION LINES

Crews restore power first to high-voltage transmission lines. These lines carry large amounts of electricity. They rarely fail but must be repaired first.

4. NEXT RESTORING DISTRIBUTION SUBSTATIONS

Crews inspect substations, which can serve hundreds or thousands of people.

5. THEN MAIN DISTRIBUTION LINES

Main lines serve essential facilities like hospitals and larger communities.



6. INDIVIDUAL HOMES AND BUSINESSES

After main line repairs are complete, we repair lines that serve individual homes and businesses.
